First Generation

1. Ryon W Sowell, son of Charles Sowell and Molly Wynns, was born on 27 Aug 1799 in North Carolina and died before 4 Dec 1852 in Maury County, Tennessee.

General Notes: Moved with his father to Tennessee in 1818.

The Bible previously mentioned (see Charles Sowell note) was given to Ryon by his wife Ann on July 4, 1826, and cost \$1.00, which no doubt represented a considerable sacrifice, since at the time several acres of good land could be purchased for \$1.00.

Records inscribed in this Bible in the beautiful handwriting of Ryon W. Sowell indicate he was an educated man and that the following children were born to this union: (see genealogy)

"Ryon's parents are a BIG mystery. Family tradition says his father was Charles Sowell, who died in Maury Co, ca 1839, but I have seen the will and Ryon is not mentioned nor is he in the family Bible." - Bob Pfenning

Ryon died before 4 Dec 1852 and after June 1850 when the US census was conducted which shows him living in Maury County Tennessee.

Ryon married **Anna Smith Letsinger**, daughter of **Andrew Letsinger** and **Unknown**, on 20 Jan 1820 in Maury County, Tennessee. Anna was born on 8 Nov 1803 in North Carolina. Other names for Anna were Ann G., Anna, and Anne.

Randolph Walker donated the land for the erection of a church and for a cemetery now known as Ridgeway community.

James Sowell served in the Confederate Army in Green's Brigade of Texas, from 1860 to 1864, returning to his home after the war, broken in sprit, to find his worldly goods dissipated and his family in poor circumstances. He set about the rebuilding of his fortune, experiencing insurmountable obstacles during the reconstruction days. Earnest Sowell remembers him in his childhood as a heart-broken, brooding man, who never recovered from the effects of the Civil War.

Obituary - 1939

In the passing away of Mrs. Lou J. M. Perry on July 11th Smithville and Bastrop County have lost their oldest citizen. Mrs. Perry had reached the wonderful age of 97 years, 5 months and 15 days. She was born at Columbia, Tennessee in the year 1842 and came to Texas with her family in 1852, settling near Bastrop. She was married to John M. Perry in 1863 who, in the War between the States, served in Parson's brigade under Captain Highsmith.

She is survived by five daughters, Mrs. F. Moore of Columbus, Mrs T.W. Maxwell of Boling, Mrs. Lulu Williams, Mrs Callis Brewer and Mrs. V.S. McGowan all of Smithville and two sons, J. E. Perry of Floydada and Lon Perry of Smithville, 15 grand-children and 18 great-grandchildren.

The following grand sons acted as pall bearers: A.R. Maxwell, T.W. Maxwell, Lyt Maxwell, Pomp Perry, Ivan Perry and Euel Jenkins.

Funeral services were held at the family residence here in Smithville Wednesday afternoon, July 12th, with the Rev. Woodrow Jones officiating. Burial took place at Oak Hill Cemetery.

Thus has passed from us a citizen that truly has performed a noble and worthy life here among our people. Coming to Texas as a mere child, this girl grew up during the times of much pioneer work. People were coming to Texas from many sections of the nation, and when they arrived they generally stayed and helped to build a community, and Mrs. Perry is one of those who stayed among the rest of our people and did her full part in bringing about a more modern civilization here in Bastrop county. We are saddened at her departure, but her life and her efforts among us are duly appreciated by all who love and admire the history of our country.

UNCLE PAT SOWELL, ELGIN'S LAST CONFEDERATE

VETERAN PASSES AWAY IN AUSTIN

Charles Patrick Sowell, lovingly known by scores as "Uncle Pat", passed on to his last reward Thursday morning, January 9th, 1936 at 6:00 o'clock at the State Confederate Home in Austin after having been confined to his bed for the past five an a half months. Uncle Pat had been unusually hale and hearty for one of his advanced years until early last year when the infirmaties of old age claimed his health. Prior to that time he walked the distance from his home to the business district each day and took keen interest in meeting his many friends and enjoying "...walk" chats. He also attended meetings and programs of William Owens Chapter U.D.C., occasionally and when prevailed upon would give interesting stories of his experiences when a member of Company E, 33rd Texas cavalry in the Confederate army. He was well-read and kept enlightened on the important current events of county, state and nation. He was strong in his beliefs and staunchly supported the principles for which he stood.

He was a Baptist by faith and was a strong, noble character. He was a kind father, a loving brother and a friend to be relied upon. He loved company and each year his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren gathered at this home to celebrate with a birthday dinner and hold open house all day in order that his friends might call and renew their bonds of friendship, these occasions being treasured by him as the happiest days of his old age.

In the early days of Elgin he was one of our most prominent and progressive business men, and for over half a century had been an influential and worthy citizen, one who took pride in seeing his town forge ahead. He was held in high regard by everyone and numbered his friends by the scores. A good many years ago he retired from business and had resided at the family home in east Elgin, where, a grandson and wife, Mr. & Mrs. Ollie Pfieffer, look after his comfort, until July of last year, when he entered the Confederate home in Austin.

Mr. Sowell was the son of Mr. & Mrs. Rhyne W. Sowell and was born Dec 16, 1844 in Murray county, Tennessee. He came to Texas in 1860, with his parents, settling in Williamson county, at Florence. From there the family went to Piney, near Bastrop, where Mr. Sowell jooined the Confederate army in 1861. His company was composed principally of Bastrop county men whose part in that great conflict has given our county a prominent part in the compilation of valuable historical facts passed down first hand from those veterans.

Uncle Pat was married to Adeline Erwin of the Piney community and she preceded him in death inn 1917. Surviving are three children of that union, Mrs.lda Pfeffer, Elgin, Gus Sowell, McDale and W. T. Sowell of Round Rock, 15 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren, and one sister, Mrs. Lou Perry, of Smithville.

Fo.llowing his death Thursday the body was brought overland to Elgin by J. C. Miller, undertakers, to the Miller Funeral home, where it lay in state until the funeral at 10:00 a.m. Friday. Large American and Confederate flags in floor standards stood furled at either end of the bier and resting against it in front was the conventional U.D.C. wreath, fashioned of read, white and blue flowers, across which was spread a small Confederate flag.

The Rev. G. M. McNeilly pastor of the First Baptist Church was in charge of the last rites

and delivered a beautiful oration, Rev. McNeiller read the lesson from an old leather bound bible, published in 1824 and purchased in 1779 by the deceased's father and treasured by members of the family for many years. The choir sang "Nothing Between," by request, and other appropriate songs.

Supt. M.M. Watson, to show the schools' deep appreciation of the historical significance of the passing of Elgin's last Confederate soldier, delegated Miss Nell Owens, one of the teachers, and ten members of the Senior Class to represent the high school as a tribute to the confederacy; while Miss Modene Griffin, principal of the grammar school, brought twelve boys and girls, and little Miss Mary Nelll Carter, mascot of William Owens Chapter of the U.D.C., all descendants of Bastrop County pioneers, to represent that school. These "honor guards" stood near the casket throughout the service at the chapel.

Pall bearers were six grandsons: Sam and Adolph Sowell, Pat, Louie, Ollie and Lonnie Pfeiffer.

Honarary pall bearers were W. B. Byers, Joe Sharp, C. K. Davenport, George Pate, Oscar Byrd, Will Standifer, Coot Hardwick, D. H. Speir and Dr. G. T. King, all of Elgin, Charley Cottingham of Agua Dulce, R. Walter Davis and D. B. Camp of Austin.

Interment was made in the Elgin Cemetery.

PAT SOWELL, LAST CONFEDERATE SOLDIER IN BASTROP COUNTY DIED

Pat Sowell, 91, the last Bastrop county survivor of the Confederate army and a long time resident of Elgin, died early Thursday at the State Confederate home in Austin.

Funeral services were held from the Miller Funeral home last Friday.

Mr Sowell was a member of Company E, 33rd Texas cavalry of the Confederate State army.

He was born in Murray county, Tenn.

Mr. Sowell was admitted to the state Confederate home at Austin July 23, 1935.
